- High school juniors must obtain a letter of approval from their principal, guidance counselor, or CVTE coordinator before registering as a non-degree student.
- All students enrolled in high school who will be attending classes during the day must obtain a letter of approval from their principal or guidance counselor.
- All home schooled students need to provide documentation of a home school plan approved by the school district in which they reside.

This concern must be communicated in writing to the Vice President of Academic Affairs. If the Vice President determines that the reasons given constitute a compelling factor to limit (with specific parameters) or deny enrollment of the student in the course by the college, that decision will be communicated to the faculty member and the student. Faculty will also be requested to complete and submit a mid-semester and end-of-semester grade check to the designated Advisor of Underage Students.

The faculty member and all signatories will be notified in writing of the approval or disapproval of this application.
